Reservations:

The Museum offers both guided and self-guided tours. A two-week advance notice is required for all tours and outreach programs. Tours are conducted Monday through Friday, from 9 AM to 3 PM. If your tour request falls within our regular open hours, (Thursday through Sunday, Noon to 4 PM), a reservation is still required. Docents can tailor their tours to topics learned in class.

Payment:

Admission is free but donations are greatly appreciated. Your donation supports our docent training and free public programs.

Confirmations:

The Museum will confirm your reservation via email about two weeks prior to your trip or outreach. Confirmations will include a letter, reservation form, rules of behavior, chaperone information, and an Educator Resource Packet with exhibit background and activities. Be sure to read your letter and reservation form thoroughly to confirm your tour/outreach date and time.

Food:

The courtyard and surrounding grounds are available for students to eat lunch with a reservation. Food and drinks are not allowed in the Museum galleries. In the case of inclement weather, the Museum does not have indoor eating facilities or food storage.
