AVAILABLE OPPORTUNITIES:

GALLERY GUIDES

Gallery Guides are friendly, engaging, trained volunteers that greet visitors, provide exhibit information, and have fun conversations about the artwork and artifacts in the Museum's galleries.

PROGRAM ASSISTANTS

Aid Museum staff in preparing materials for programs, events, festivals and workshops.

ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT

Help with mailings and other administrative duties for events and programs.

OUTREACH ASSISTANTS

Facilitate hands-on workshops at offsite community festivals, schools and local organizations.

INTERNS

Assist staff members with special projects relating to exhibits, collections or education programs.

(requires a commitment of at least 2 months and 10-20 hours a week)

DOCENTS

Docents are trained volunteers who provide essential group learning experiences through tours and outreach programs at schools and community centers in Ontario. No previous background in art or history is required, just a passion for learning and interacting with visitors. Docent training begins in April of each year.
